This website is run by Castlethorpe Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

Technical information about this website's accessibility

Castlethorpe Parish Council is committed to making its website accessible, in accordance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

PDFs and other documents

Many of our older PDFs and Word documents do not meet accessibility standards – for example, they may not be structured so they're accessible to a screen reader. This does not meet WCAG 2.2AA success criterion 4.1.2 (name, role value).

The accessibility regulations do not require us to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018 if they're not essential to providing our services. For example, we do not plan to fix meeting agendas or minutes for meetings which were published prior to 23 September 2018.

Any new PDFs or Word documents we publish will meet accessibility standards.

How we tested this website

This website was last tested in January 2026. Tests were carried out by both internal systems and our website provider, bpw design.

We tested all pages using software that highlights WCAG 2.2AA errors and alerts, based on the WebAIM system.

What we're doing to improve accessibility

We plan to improve accessibility by;

Provide staff & council volunteers training to ensure that all new content added meets accessibility criteria.

We also run monthly and quarterly reports to identify and address accessibility issues.

This statement was prepared in January 2026 and will be reviewed annually in May.
